

COMPASSION IN THE COLD...

Sub-zero temperatures and forecasts of snow is how February greets us, and it's at times like these that I am grateful for central heating.

Sadly that isn't a universal provision, and at the tail-end of January I was involved in providing emergency shelter for the rough sleepers in our town beyond the regular Friday-Sunday evenings catered for by *The Living Room.* In such conditions the Borough Council are obliged to find shelter for the homeless, but have only four beds available. In this instance they paid for a further four to stay at B&Bs but that still left another eight without shelter. This marks an

abject failure and is a sad indictment of attitudes in our current society.

And yet we are called to be different as the people of God. Proverbs 19:17 says "Whoever is generous to the poor lends to the Lord, and he will repay him for his deed."

Jesus likens himself to a homeless man in Matthew 25, arguing that when we respond with compassion to the needs of the poor it is like we are tending to the needs of Jesus himself. Too often we can overlook our responsibility to be advocates for justice, forgetting it features consistently in scripture; from Old Testament laws to the teaching and example of Jesus.

So as winter takes hold, let us not be coldhearted. The need is great but we can make a difference; indeed God calls us to!

THE MILLER'S IN MOZAMBIQUE



Our BMS missionaries Annet and Damien Miller share their latest news from Mozambique, including a new arrival in the family!

Now listen, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money. "Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes. Instead, you ought to say, "If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this or that." James 4:13-15.

Illustrating the law

There have been big changes within AMAC (the Mozambican Association of Christian Lawyers) over the last year. Several members of staff have moved on but the Lord has provided committed individuals to take their place. As such, Annet has spent a lot of time training the new guys and helping them to settle in to the AMAC Beira team. In addition, Annet oversaw a move from AMAC Beira's old office on the grounds of the First Baptist Church in Ponta-Gêa to a more spacious apartment in Pioneiros.

Damien has been working in the community of Manga Loforte in Beira, using an illustrated album to raise awareness and reflection on legal issues relating to marriage. Designed by AMAC, the album uses pictures and stories to deconstruct and explain the law on marriage, divorce and cohabitation. The album was first used to train seven facilitators who work for the Christian development organisation Oasis Mozambique. They each received a copy of the album and trained a further group of 12 mother leaders, who in turn shared the information with a further 12 women. Questions and issues arise from the training and this creates the opportunity for an AMAC lawyer to do a follow-up visit to answer

queries, provide more detail, give legal advice and also to take on cases when necessary.

Mourning into dancing

In mission anything can happen, and usually does. Early in 2018, we fully expected to be in the UK come the Summer, meeting with family and friends, visiting our supporters and sharing with you what God has been doing in Mozambique. Yet in May we received the sad news that Annet had been denied a visa to visit the UK. So, no Home Assignment, no family reunion, no respite from the wear and tear of mission life in Africa. Feeling confused and angry, we were left reeling from this unexpected and unfair development. We wept. We cried out to God in frustration.

Two weeks after this disappointing news and a matter of days before we would have boarded the plane to the UK, we received another surprise, this time courtesy of a small plastic wand displaying two red lines. Our God had chosen to bless us with the gift of life during this difficult time. He replaced our sorrow with joy, turned our mourning into dancing. In October we travelled to Annet's native Uganda and as I write to you now from Kampala we are expecting the new arrival to the Miller family to make an appearance any day. [Stop press: Annet gave birth to Conrad Theodore Miller on 10th January 2019].
