The Christian festival of Easter marks the most significant event in human history - the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

For many, it has simply become synonymous with chocolate eggs and two Bank Holidays, but it's importance drills to the very core of who we are. If we pause to think about the events recorded in Jerusalem almost 2,000 years ago, we are left with a remarkable question to answer:

#### MAUNDY THURSDAY (18th) 7.30pm, Church



Friday 10th, 7pm: Joint Prayer Meeting


Thursday 16th, 23rd, 30th, 7.30pm: Prayer Meeting
