Stamp Collecting For Mission...

Did you know there's money to be had from your old stamps? For several years we have collected used stamps to send to our partner mission agency, BMS,


who have been operating a stamp bureau for almost 100 years. Once received, BMS collate and sell them on to collectors and dealers. The income raised goes directly to BMS to support the work of transforming lives around the world. Believe it or not, this raises over £10,000 per year!

All you have to do is to trim the stamps from your envelopes with a maximum of 5mm (1/4 inch) of the envelope showing all round, but be careful not to damage any part of the stamp, including the perforations.

Any envelopes with first day issues, pre-decimal or older foreign stamps, unusual postmarks, designs or other marks on them should be left in tact - they could be especially valuable.

There is a basket on the Information Table upstairs for you to place your stamps.

Who Cares? Vision Evening

Several years ago we took part in a county-wide initiative called 'Who Cares?' This involved engaging our community by asking a one-question survey: 'What hurts the most?' The results were recorded online and once analysed by the Who Cares team, were returned to churches with a breakdown of the issues that are causing the most pain in people's lives. The church was then invited to respond to those needs in any ways it deemed most appropriate.

The results helped to shape our mission planning and were partly behind our decision to partner with CAP, so it was a significant piece of outreach by the church.

This survey is being run again, and an 'East Coast' team comprising churches in Great Yarmouth borough, Lowestoft and Beccles are holding a vision night for anyone interested in taking part. This could be a good opportunity for us as a church to engage with friends, family, neighbours, colleagues and those around us. The vision evening includes an introduction by Bishop Sandy Millar (former Vicar at Holy Trinity Brompton), and will include more details on how to get involved and what it requires from churches. It takes place on **Tuesday 17th March, 7.30pm** at the **King's Centre, Queen Anne's Road.** All are invited.
